Our Sacrament of Confirmation programme for 2016-2017 enabled our 42 candidates to strengthen their relationship with God, receive the seal of the Holy Spirit and deepen their baptismal grace.

Utilizing a number of resources, including the "I Am Confirmed"



programme produced by the Middlesborough
Diocesan Trust supplemented with a number of
sessions taken from our previous programme
"Being More Like Christ", our candidates looked
at a number of themes as part of their
preparation for being confirmed. These included
exploring the Church and its role as a
community, the Person of Jesus, Reconciliation,
the Confirmation Ceremony and its symbols,

as well as the Gifts of the Holy Spirit that they would receive: Wisdom, Understanding, Right Judgement, Courage, Knowledge, Reverence and Wonder & Awe. The course combined an overview of the themes; Scripture readings, as well as practical exercises designed to invoke discussion of the key issues and was delivered by a group of friendly and enthusiastic catechists.
