IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING SAFEGUARDING:

We are a fortunate parish, in that there are a number of volunteers willing to give their skills, experience and time to assist the numerous groups that take place in the church. As the safeguarding lead, I am keen for this practice to continue. It is important that all prospective volunteers are deemed appropriate to undertake the role they wish to assist with, before doing so. The Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) formerly known as the Criminal Records Bureau (CRB) is the safeguarding process the diocese use for all regulated activity within the parish, to ensure the safeguarding of vulnerable groups, including children and vulnerable adults.

Any individual wishing to undertake a volunteer role within the church must undertake a DBS process with the parish. Oftentimes prospective volunteers have an existing enhanced DBS from their current place of work and are under the misapprehension that this will suffice. A paper DBS is not portable and therefore cannot be used by the parish, as evidence that an individual is deemed fit for the role they wish to undertake. The exception is if an individual has an online DBS account, then the diocese as a registered organisation must be given permission by the individual, for the diocese to access their account to ensure that a satisfactory enhanced level is in place. That being said, the portability of an online account is very limited. If for instance your DBS is an enhanced level for children and adults and your role in the church is just for children, then the diocese is not permitted to see the DBS due to the adult component and vice versa if your role on the church is just for adults. Individuals with an online DBS account will still need to complete a safeguarding declaration form and follow through with the necessary ID verification process. These complicated factors are the reason why the diocese are keen for individuals to undertake a parish DBS. If you have any questions about this, then the diocese are happy for individuals to contact them directly during office hours on **020 7261 1606**.

For those who do not have an online DBS account, please pick up a 'pack' from the parish office to begin the parish DBS process. Within the pack is an application form, two reference request forms (you must get your referees to complete this), an ID verification and safeguarding declaration form. Completing these forms does not mean that the DBS process has been complete. Once the application form and two references have been completed, I can then contact the diocese for the actual DBS form. This is posted to me and I will then contact the individual to arrange a time for them to complete it and bring original documents as required to verify ID. I will then send your DBS form to the diocese with your ID and safeguarding declaration form. The diocese will send your form and documents off for processing and you will be informed in due course of the outcome. A satisfactory enhanced level check is required in order to undertake the role you wish to assist with.

Facilitators of groups and prospective volunteers, please contact me directly to seek advice and guidance **before** engaging in any activity. It is imperative that we follow through with the expectations of the diocese to ensure the safety of all.
