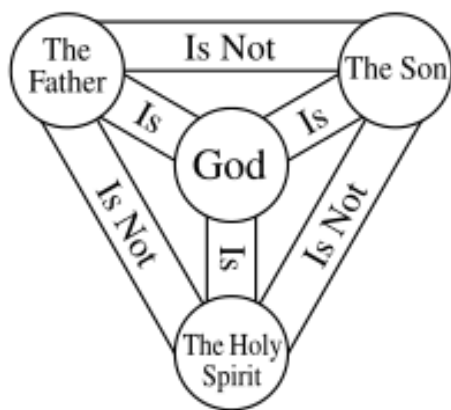

THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

YEAR B

Blessed John Henry Newman wrote some beautiful Hymns and Prayers, one of which begins, “**Firmly I believe, and truly, God is Three and God is One....**”, very appropriate to herald today's Celebration of the **Three Persons in One God**: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. This is, indeed, a **mystery of Faith!** The Gifts of the Holy Spirit, which we considered last week, will help us to accept this fundamental Teaching of the Church. The Doctrine of the Blessed Trinity is, to our limited human minds, not the easiest Truth to comprehend. This, of course, is where the Gifts of Faith, Hope and Charity come into play; we *believe* and *trust* that God, Infinitely Perfect, in His Love for us, can never tell us anything which is untrue, and will not ask the impossible of us in terms of belief. We can be *certain* that He *will* bring us, if we do our best to *love* and *obey* Him, to Heaven.

If you are looking to better understand this Truth, for your own knowledge or to explain it to others, then one of the clearest explanations of the Three-in-Oneness of God is to be found in Frank Sheed's book, *Theology for Beginners*, chapter 5, *The Three Persons*. This can be further simplified in order to explain it to our children; they also have a right to the Truth, and we have a duty to do our best to teach them.

It is vital to remember, though, that to *simplify* does not mean to water down or to omit truth.

For those who would postpone such teaching until children are 'old enough' (and who of us will ever be 'old enough' to fully understand this particular Doctrine?!), they would do well to heed the words of a renowned educational psychologist, Jerome Bruner, who said that “...*anything can be taught to any one, at any age, as long as it is properly thought out first...*” Saint Thérèse of Lisieux (whose Mother died when Thérèse was four years old) once asked her mother (Saint Zélie Martin) about our capacity for God and was shown two very different sized containers, each filled to the brim with water; as Zélie explained to her daughter, just as each vessel was completely filled, God fills us with His Grace according to our created capacity and our openness to it. Any preparation required to teach our precious young people will be very beneficial to teachers as well as their pupils.

Take heart in that if you find yourself pondering and puzzling over this Doctrine, so did the great Theologians! Only God can fully understand Himself! For a more detailed exposition of the subject we have, of course, the Catechism of the Catholic Church (Section 2, the Profession of the Christian Faith) intended by the Teaching Authority (or Magisterium) of the Church as the 'yardstick' against which all publications claiming to be Catholic, including your children's R.E. materials, must be assessed.

In this day and age, this Doctrine may be a stumbling block to be overcome in a journey of Faith. It takes Prayer and perseverance to break down barriers; we cannot allow our human limitations to be transferred to God. We have to make a 'leap of faith' over the barrier! Our loving Belief in and Witness to this fundamental and deep Truth will effectively help to overcome any doubts and objections which can be raised. Our lives must be permeated by this belief which we express, among other ways, in making the *Sign of the Cross* and in reciting the *Creed* every Sunday and Solemnity.

The colour of envelopes is changed each tax year, so if you have old ones, please destroy them.

If you have left the Gift Aid Scheme, kindly stop using your numbered envelopes with immediate effect.

HMRC rules which govern the scheme are very strict, and state that numbered envelopes may only be used by the taxpayer who has signed the declaration form. Therefore, you should **never share envelopes** with other people.

To join this scheme, please contact John Byrne via the Parish Office. Through the Gift Aid scheme, the parish can reclaim tax you have already paid, **at no extra cost to yourself, if you are a taxpayer and you qualify for the scheme.**

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION PROGRAMME

First Communions will take place across three Masses. The first is on **Sunday** 10th June; the second is on **Sunday** 17th June; the third is on **Saturday** 23rd June 2018. All Masses are at 12 Noon. Practices will take place in the church on **Wednesday 6th June** (for the first Mass), **Wednesday 13th June** (for the second Mass) and **Wednesday 20th June** (for the third Mass). In each case, the practice will run from 6pm - 7.30pm.

The 11th and final session for our First Holy Communicants, entitled "To Love and Serve" will take place on Saturday 30th June 2018 from 10am - 11.30am in the hall. The next day, Sunday 1st July 2018, is the day of our "Going Forth" Mass of Thanksgiving, which will be at 12 Noon. This will be followed by a special lunch.

THE NEW GENERAL DATA PROTECTION LEGISLATION - FR DEO WRITES:

"New European Union General Data Protection Legislation came into force on Friday 25th May 2018. This will have a great impact upon us all. We are obliged to know who has access to all personal information held in the parish, what information is held, and in which format/s. Many of you volunteer for the parish, or have done so in the past. Therefore you might keep personal information at home or work, in a file and/or on a PC, phone, laptop or other device. Please let either me or the Parish Office know if this applies, or might apply, to you, so that I can inform you what as to what you may need to do, going forward. Thanks to all who have responded so far. Members of the clergy and the PPC, the Parish Secretary and our MC, have attended training sessions on GDPR. Things will become clearer over the next few weeks. The Archbishop encourages us all to help implement these changes, and I thank you in advance for your co-operation. Severe penalties may be imposed for non compliance."

KEEPING YOUR FINANCIAL INFORMATION SECURE

With GDPR in mind, this legislation also covers financial information held by the parish, such as that relating to Gift Aid. Please be aware that we will never send a stranger to your home, or ask them to contact you in any way to obtain your banking or other personal details. Should you ever receive such an approach, you should politely but firmly decline, and inform the Parish Office straight away, and, if necessary, the Police. Sadly, there will always be criminals out there hoping to obtain your data, so do remain vigilant, and always report anything of concern.
