ENTRANCE ANTIPHON (cf Psalm 104:3-4)

Let the hearts that seek the Lord rejoice; turn to the Lord and his strength; constantly seek his face.

FIRST READING (Jeremiah 31:7-9)

The Lord says this:

Shout with joy for Jacob! Hail the chief of nations! Proclaim! Praise! Shout: 'The Lord has saved his people, the remnant of Israel!' ANNUAL BLESSING OF GRAVES

This will be on Remembrance Sunday, 14th November 2021.

We shall meet from 2.45pm for a prompt 3pm start, at Streatham Park Cemetery, Rowan Road, SW16 5JG.

From the car park, walk down the main path to the end, then turn left, and you will come to a row of tombs on the right.

You should come dressed for poor weather and muddy conditions. Please take care to avoid traffic, and look out for one another, as there will be many cars around.

A short service will be conducted, with a blessing of graves.

Depending upon the weather, how light it remains and the number of priests present, individual graves may then be blessed by the priests. Please have consideration for the clergy, most of whom will need to get back to their parishes for evening Mass.
