Addendum 1: Noise and Noise abatement

Over the summer, we had a series of very serious meetings with Lambeth Council over our neighbours (fully justified and evidenced) complaints about noise from parties in the Hall. This is a very serious matter: most importantly morally (we should not be upsetting our neighbours – at all, let alone to the point of misery, 'where I don't want to come home' as one said) but also legally, as Lambeth are very close to taking the Parish to court.

These recommendations were approved by Lambeth and I recommend in the strongest terms that we urge Fr Deo to adopt them urgently.

To advise Fr Deo to consider:

 Having a number for residents to call if complaints need to be made when the events take place

- To consider whether a member of staff should be on site when the events take place.
- To think about a leaflet drop to the community, both to apologise and to provide the number to call when events were taking place.
- To consider examining and making changes to the contracts people sign when hiring the hall: we note that this may involve the diocesan property section.
- To consider installing air conditioning
- To consider bringing back our own sound system (possibly with a sound limiter)
- To consider disallowing external speakers and to consider whether built-in speakers maybe feasible
- It was mentioned that the back door and windows on that side were historically closed and locked. It would be a good idea to ensure this continues rather than relying on the good will of party goers.
- to consider laminating some signs and placing them in key positions. Such as:
 - 1. A sign indicating where the speaker/s should be placed.
 - 2. A sign for any door that is used for entry/exit, asking for it to be kept closed.

ADDENDUM 3: Bake sale for the local charity?

I spoke to Deacon Ged this evening after 6:15pm mass about organising a fundraising bake sale for the local charity that I volunteer for in my spare time, Read Easy Lambeth who provide free volunteer-led one-to-one coaching for adults who struggle to read. We are a new charity set up last December 2022 and since July 2023 we have 8 coaches working with readers, including a gig worker wanting to improve their employment prospects and a mum wanting to learn to read before her children go to secondary school. We have a waiting list of 25 adults referred for coaching, with new referrals every week. Our mission is to address inequalities in the borough by enabling all adults to have the literacy skills to achieve their potential and live life to the fullest. There are no literacy statistics for Lambeth, but 22.7% adults in the borough lack essential skills. As the Fundraiser for the group, I have been applying for grant applications and have unfortunately not been very successful, so I am looking at alternative options and I mentioned to Deacon Ged about the possibility of hosting a bake sale after the Sunday masses who mentioned that it would be worth getting in touch and trying to organise this and find out availability as I understand the coffee mornings are currently scheduled in.
